I represent respondents Meta Platforms, Inc. ("Meta") and Mark Zuckerberg in the above-referenced case. The petition for a writ of certiorari was filed in this case on January 6, 2025. On February 27, 2025, the Court requested a response to the petition by March 31, 2025.

Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 30.4, respondents Meta and Mr. Zuckerberg respectfully request that the Court extend the time to file a brief in opposition to the petition by 30 days, up to and including April 30, 2025. The extension is requested because the current deadline overlaps with deadlines that counsel for Meta and Mr. Zuckerberg have in other cases in March, including a reply in support of a motion for preliminary injunction in *American Efficient v. FERC*, 1:25-cv-00068 (M.D.N.C), which was filed March 10; a response to a motion to intervene in the same case due March 25; oral argument in *Loomer v. Zuckerberg*, No. 23-3158 (9th Cir.), on March 19; oral argument in *Nachman v. Tesla, Inc.*, No. 24-2362 (2d Cir.), on March 20; objections to a report and recommendation in *Municipalities of Bayamon v. Exxon Mobil*, 3:22-cv-01550 (D.P.R) due March 21; and a trial in *VidStream v. Twitter*, 3:16-cv-00764-N (N.D. Tex.), starting on April 7 with associated pretrial preparation and a pretrial conference anticipated the week of March 31. The requested extension would better enable preparation of a response that would be helpful to the Court.
