Re: *Children's Health Defense v. Meta Platforms, Inc., et al.*, No. 24-732 (U.S.)

Dear Mr. Harris:

I represent respondents Meta Platforms, Inc. ("Meta") and Mark Zuckerberg in the above-referenced case. The petition for a writ of certiorari was filed in this case on January 6, 2025. On February 27, 2025, the Court requested a response to the petition by March 31, 2025. On March 13, 2025, respondents Meta and Mr. Zuckerberg moved to extend the time to respond to April 30, 2025, which was granted on March 14, 2025.

Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 30.4, respondents Meta and Mr. Zuckerberg respectfully request that the Court extend the time to file a brief in opposition to the petition by an additional 30 days, up to and including May 30, 2025. Respondents request this extension because the current deadline overlaps with deadlines that counsel for Meta and Mr. Zuckerberg have in other cases in April, including a trial in *VidStream v. Twitter*, 3:16-cv-00764-N (N.D. Tex.), that began on April 7 and is expected to last through April 15, and several dispositive filings in *Lemon v. Musk*, CGC-24-616892 (Cal. Sup. Ct.), due on April 14 and May 2. The deadline also overlaps with international travel counsel has planned from April 15 through April 23. The requested extension would better enable preparation of a response that would be helpful to the Court.
