OF CERTIORARI

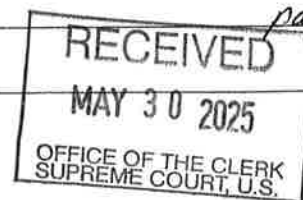
I, Bryant Buckhanan, being duly sworn, deposes and
says:

That I am the petitioner herein and submit this affidavit
in support of my application for leave to file for a writ
of Certiorari within sixty days after the denial of my
Petition for Leave to Appeal by the Illinois Supreme Court
pursuant to U.S. S.Ct.R. 13.5.

On August 11, 2022, I was convicted of Murder
in the 1st degree. Trial Judge Honorable Michael R. Clancy.

I received a sentence of 60 years in the
Illinois Department of Correction.

I desire to take an appeal to this Court from that
conviction and sentence in good faith but the prison
administrators have craftily thwart myself and other



incarcerated persons from taking advantage of the law library through machination such as lock-downs, mailing out our appeals, notices, writs etc., weeks after they are placed to authorities for mailing.

The institution has created their on policy of you can't participate in lawful competition through the law library unless proof is shown that you have a deadline, yet, the remedy offered is place your privilege [confident, legal, mail, work in a box, yet, the legal material is exposed to the elements on the return to us, not protected by through delivery with the institutions open mail and cost.

The Supreme Court has recognized that officials might devise procedural systems [including blind alley ways and quagmires just discussed] in order to trip[] up the incarcerated persons from getting the proper filing.

They have also weaponized a Illinois Statute that allows the institution to open mail going to the Clerk of the Courts, Supreme Court Clerks included, coming in. The mail is not sealed so it is exposed, so, anyone with bad intentions, can make sure it does not reach it's destination because IT IS NEVER SEALED.

I plead with the Clerk to please observe the attached Motion for Extension of time to file for a Writ of Certiorari. I have been unable to search case laws, opinions, etc., because of the level 1, 2, 3 lockdowns. I cannot send to the U.S. Supreme Court a half baked

petition, wasting the Court's time. I don't live in a blame culture and I make no excuses for not getting goals accomplished. My intention is sincere.

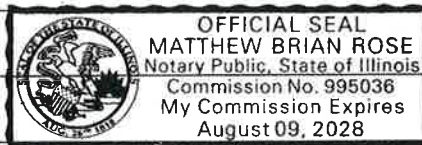
