Pursuant to Rules 13.5 and 30, petitioner JOSE BOSQUEZ, respectfully asks the Court for a 60-day extension of time, to and including April 4, 2025, to file a petition for a writ of certiorari in this matter.

MEMORANDUM DECISION

Presiding Judge Andrew M. Jacobs, Judge Jennifer M. Perkins, and Judge David D. Weinzweig delivered the following decision.

PER CURIAM:

- ¶1 Petitioner Jose Bosquez seeks review of the superior court's order denying his petition for post-conviction relief, filed pursuant to Arizona Rule of Criminal Procedure 32.1. This is Bosquez's third petition.
- Absent an abuse of discretion or error of law, this court will not disturb a superior court's ruling on a petition for post-conviction relief. *State v. Gutierrez*, 229 Ariz. 573, 577, ¶ 19 (2012). It is the petitioner's burden to show that the superior court abused its discretion by denying the petition for post-conviction relief. *See State v. Poblete*, 227 Ariz. 537, 538, ¶ 1 (App. 2011) (petitioner has burden of establishing abuse of discretion on review).
- ¶3 We have reviewed the record in this matter, the superior court's order denying the petition for post-conviction relief, the petition for review, and response. We find the petitioner has not established an abuse of discretion.
- ¶4 We grant review but deny relief.
