

Dear Mr. Scott S. Harris, Clerk,

I, Andrew Kosiba, respectfully request that you allow the filing of my Petition for a Writ of Certiorari out of time due to exceptional circumstances. In support of this motion, I offer the following:

During the month of June, 2024, which is part of the 90 days I was allotted by the court, I relocated myself and my family from New York to Virginia, a transition which involved significant challenges, including managing logistics of moving, establishing a new home, starting a new job and acclimating to a new environment. Navigating these changes and fulfilling my responsibilities proved overwhelming during this period. During this difficult period, my papers related to this case were inaccessible in storage for about 15 days.

I also needed to learn how to print the booklet format required for submission. This printing project took me 10 days more than I estimated or allotted to the project. I have never done such a printing project before and was unaware of the difficulty involved, therefore my estimate was inaccurate. I believe this printing issue may be considered forgivable under the circumstances.



Thirdly, I am not a professional bar member and I must work on my petition outside of work hours and family commitments. I estimate this limitation contracted my allotment of 90 days by another 15 days.

Given the above facts, I was not able to utilize 40 of the 90 days I was allocated by the court due to the circumstances outlined above. It has always been my good faith intention to comply with the Court's procedures, and the oversight was due to forgivable neglect and circumstances and was not intentional.

Request for Relief:

In light of these facts, I am requesting that I receive just 40% of those days back. I lost 40 days and am asking the court to give me back 15 of those days. This would amount to a 15-day extension of my filing deadline from my previous filing deadline of September 15, 2024, to an extended deadline of September 30, 2024.

There is no prejudice to the opposing party caused by granting me an extension to file. The opposing party still has all the time they are allowed to file a response, if they decide to respond. The issues are still alive and are still a matter of great public interest.

I assure the Court that this request is made in good faith.
