

ORDER

Pending before the Court is Petitioner's *Pro Se* Initial Unamended Petition For Writ Of Habeas Corpus And Motion for Appointment Of Counsel And Motion For Time For Counsel, Following Appointment, To Investigate And Present All Available Claims For Relief In Petitioner for Writ Of Habeas Corpus, and Petitioner's Motion To Proceed In Forma Pauperis.

It appears from Petitioner's Motion To Proceed In Forma Pauperis and Petitioner's Affidavit of Indigency, which is attached to the Motion, that the Petitioner is indigent. Accordingly, the Motion To Proceed In Forma Pauperis is GRANTED. The Clerk shall file this case in forma pauperis. 28 U.S.C. § 1915(a).

Appointment of counsel for indigent capital habeas petitioners is mandated by 21 U.S.C. § 848(q). McFarland v. Scott, 512 U.S. 849, 114 S.Ct. 2568, 2571, 129 L.Ed.2d 666 (1994); Dicks v. Dutton, 969 F.2d 207, 208 (6th Cir. 1992). In light of the issues presented in this case, the interests of justice will be served if the Petitioner is represented by counsel. Accordingly, Petitioner's Motion For Appointment Of Counsel is GRANTED. The Court appoints the Office of the Federal Defender, Middle District of Tennessee, or its designee, to represent Petitioner in this matter. The Clerk is
