ORDER:

Donatus Iriele moves for a certificate of appealability (“COA”) in order to appeal the district court’s denial of his 28 U.S.C. § 2255 motion. To merit a COA, Iriele must show that reasonable jurists would find debatable both (1) the merits of an underlying claim, and (2) the procedural issues that he seeks to raise. *See* 28 U.S.C. § 2253(c)(2); *Slack v. McDaniel*, 529 U.S. 473, 478 (2000). Iriele’s motion for a COA is DENIED because he has failed to make the requisite showing.
