

- 1) Petitioner-Howard was declared a vexatious litigator in the Marion County Common Pleas Court Case No. 2023-CV-339, on January 2024, and sanctions were imposed in February 2024
- 2) Petitioner-Howard filed a an "Application to continue legal proceedings" in Marion County Common Pleas Court Case No. 2023-CV-339, the Application was denied by Judge Matthew P. Frericks. R.C. 2323.52
- 3) Petitioner-Howard filed an "Application to continue legal proceedings" to the Marion County Common Pleas Court, to continue litigation in the Franklin County Common Pleas Court Case No. 2020-CV-2847, Ohio Tenth Appellate District Court of Appeals No. 21AP-283, cite Howard v. Mgmt & Training Corp., 2022 Ohio 4071 (Ohio 10 App. Dist.).
- 4) Petitioner-Howard filed a "Complaint for a writ of mandamus" to the Ohio Third District Court of Appeals, Case No. 9-24-036. R.C. 2323.52(G)
- 5) Petitioner-Howard filed a "Complaint for a writ of mandamus" to the Ohio Supreme Court, Case No. 2024-1645, cite State ex Rel Howard v. Willamowski, 2025 Ohio Lexis 885, motion for reconsideration at 2025 Ohio Lexis 419 denied. Reconsideration denied April 29, 2025


RECONSIDERATION ENTRY
