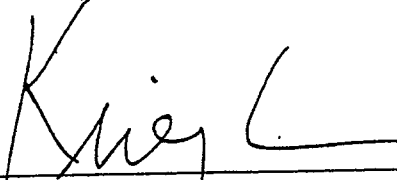

ORDER

THE COURT:

The court has read and considered the petition for writ of certiorari and request for judicial notice filed December 1, 2017. The petition and request are denied. Petitioner fails to demonstrate the appellate division's decision exceeded its jurisdiction. (Code Civ. Proc., § 1068; *Dvorin v. Appellate Dept.* (1975) 15 Cal.3d 648, 650; *Auto Equity Sales, Inc. v. Superior Court* (1962) 57 Cal.2d 450, 454-455.) To the extent petitioner seeks a writ of mandate, the petition is denied because petitioner fails to demonstrate the appellate division abused its discretion. (*Anchor Marine Repair Co. v. Magnan* (2001) 93 Cal.App.4th 525, 529.) To the extent petitioner seeks an order transferring the matter to this court, the petition is

denied because petitioner fails to comply with California Rules of Court, rules 8.1005 and 8.1006, and further fails to demonstrate that transfer is necessary to secure uniformity of decision or to settle an important question of law (Cal. Rules of Court, rule 8.1002).
