MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO SUBMIT

A PETITION FOR A WRIT OF CERTIORARI

I. INTRODUCTION

COMES NOW Petitioner, Arnold Mathis ("Mathis"), pro se, an incarcerated person, to submit this Request For An Extension of Time To Submit A Petition For Writ of Certiorari. Mathis requests an extension of sixty (60) days or otherwise until June 8, 2018.

II. JURISDICTION

This Court has jurisdiction to entertain a Petition for a Writ of Certiorari to the Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1254(1) and this Motion pursuant to Supreme Court Rule ("S.Ct.R.") 13(5).

III. REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Mr. Mathis requires the extension of time so that he may compile and present his Petition for a Writ of Certiorari.

Mathis presently has a prison job in which he works Monday - Friday, leaving him Saturday and Sunday to work on legal material.

The prison has five (5) law computers for approximately 1,400 prisoners in the law library and has no

hard copy publications for use. There is one (1) law computer in his housing unit which serves approximately 128 prisoners. Access to a law computer can be very competitive and difficult.

Mathis requires this extension of time to formulate, present and type the issues for the Writ of Certiorari. Mathis continues to apply himself for the completion of the Petition for a Writ of Certiorari without undue delay.

The Government will not be harmed by this extension of time; however Mathis will be irreparably harmed without it.

Mathis does not seek the extension of time to unnecessarily delay any proceeding, nor harass or annoy any party, including the Court.

IV. CONCLUSION AND PRAYER

Therefore, for the foregoing reasons, Mr. Mathis requests the Honorable Justice to clarify his filing deadline or in the alternative to Grant this extension of time to file his Petition for a Writ of Certiorari for sixty (60) days or otherwise until June 8, 2018.
