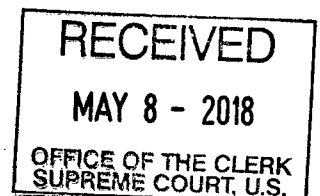

MR. SALEMI'S MOTION REQUESTING
60-DAY EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE
REQUEST FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI

Mr. Salemi received the denial of his appeal from the Eleventh Circuit Court of Appeals, dated. February 16, 2018. Mr. Salemi is proceeding to file a request for a writ of certiorari with this Court, and is doing so as an incarcerated and pro se litigant. As such, he must overcome the many obstacles associated with prison life that hinder an otherwise earlier filing and requests an additional 60 days to do so.

These obstacles include: recalls for weather, census counts, staff meetings, staff training, staff shortages, cutting of the grass, security issues, and many other things that inmates are not even informed of the reasons for keeping them locked down. These all affect inmate movement and the access to the Education Department where the 1 copy machine, 8 non-memory typewriters, and 12 law library computer terminals are housed and shared by the over 2,000 men housed in this prison.



Therefore, Mr. Salemi believes that a 60-day extension of time will allow him to overcome these obstacles and properly prepare his filing for this Court.
