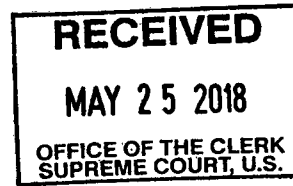

RE: Request for an Extension to submit a Petition for a Writ of Certiorari

Dear Sir/Madam,

On March 05, 2018, the Appellate Court of the Eleventh Circuit in Georgia dismissed my Petition for a Rehearing En Banc, giving me 90 days if I wanted to petition the Supreme Court for a writ of certiorari. According to my reckoning those 90 days will end on June 03.

I may well be able to get the required documents ready, for them to be in the hand of the Court by that time, but to be sure, I herewith petition for a two weeks' extension.

May I assure you, so far, the 90 days have not been spent in idleness. Going pro se for most of the time my case has been in the courts, during these 90 days I have contacted a considerable number of Religious Liberty legal firms in Washington DC and lawyer's firms in Denver CO to change that status – but this effort has not been crowned with success.

Then, also, during those 90 days, because of sickness in the family, I've had to twice visit California from my home state of Colorado, the latter time on occasion of my brother's death.

On top of that, in the latter two-three weeks my computer has gone on total strike, which has required that computer to spend 1-1/2 weeks in the repair shop.
