1. According to Supreme Court Rule 30.4, undersigned bring forth a request in letter form. I wish to submit a "writ of certiorari" to challenge United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit's mandate order filed on May 8, 2018 in relation to order of March 16, 2018 pursuant to case no. 17-5258 underlying case no. 1:17-cv-00063-BAH (a copy of the order could not be included with this letter at this time because there is no access to a copy machine).

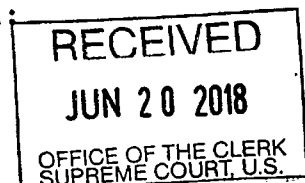
2. According to Supreme Court Rule 13.5, it states in part: "An application to extend the time to file shall set out the basis for jurisdiction in this Court,"; which leads to Rule 10(a): "or has so far departed from the accepted and usual course of judicial proceedings", Id., leaving an impression that due process violation does fall under "considerations governing review on certiorari" Id., giving jurisdiction, respectively. Id.

3. I realize to say under "good faith", this letter should have been forwarded at least 10 days before the date the petition is due." Id. It was not my intent to disregard the rule due to my current endeavor as a federal prisoner located under high security in a U.S. Penitentiary, it has been most frustrating and nearly impossible to file under "good faith" a petition in a timely manner. Between March 16, 2018 to June 12, 2018, the institution has been on ten ("10") lockdown(s), during which no access to the courts to properly research, draft, and prepare a final writ of certiorari petition for review. Wich also, case a (late) request for an extension of time ("meaning to file at least 10 days before due date of petition").

4. I pray you take into serious consideration my current plight and being above reproach to consider that this request falls under "extraordinary circumstances" to grant this instant (extension of time) letter. . . .under justification, respectfully. Thank you for your time. Until then:
