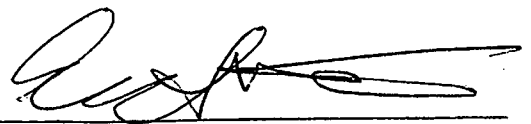
HONORABLE NEIL M. GORSUCH, ASSOCIATE JUSTICE

Petitioner's IFP petition was returned because the deputy clerk. Ms. Lisa Nesbit, refused to docket it due to a 2008 decision by the Court to not accept any "noncriminal" petitions without prepayment of fees and 40 booklet format.

The issue in the instant case is a challenge to my conviction in cases number 96-cr-40048 and 96-cr-40122. I am challenging the denial by the district and 8<sup>th</sup> circuit of petitions for writs of coram nobis, which this Honorable Court has repeatedly classes as extensions of the criminal case. I have pointed this out to Ms. Nesbit but she has returned for a second time my ten copies in 8 ½ X 11 format.

In order to raise the money to pay the fee and print the petition in booklet form I need some additional time. I am respectfully asking the Court to grant me 60 days, allowing filing until January 20, 2018. The 8<sup>th</sup> circuit denied a petition for rehearing on August 23, 2017. This motion could not be presented earlier as it was not until today that the ten copies were received from Ms. Nesbit.
