Applications to Supreme Court Justice
for an Extension of Time to file a
Writ of Certiorari in the Supreme
Court of the United States

Now Comes, Pro Se. - Petitioner,
Darren Taylor pursuant to S.C.R. 13.5,
22, and 30 and asks this Court to
extend the time for petitioner to file
his Writ of Certiorari in this court by
sixty (60) days and states the following

colloquy in support thereof.

On November 29, 2017 the United States Court of Appeals Sixth Circuit denied petitioners timely Petition for Rehearing wherefore petitioners' Writ of Certiorari is due in this court on or before February 27, 2018.

That on December 29, 2017 the Lebanon Correctional Institutional (LCI) law library updated its Lexis Nexis legal computers and by extension its word processing capabilities.

All documents previously held or stored in the old system cannot be completed or transferred into the new system and will have to be redone on the new system, and at present the new system has no word processing capabilities, storage, or ability to copy case law. (see attached Institutional Memo).

Petitioner is housed at LCI which is a "Level 3A Restrictive movement" facility where in fact all out of cell movement is by "pass authorization" including law library access.

Access to the law library per policy

59-LEG-01 is by written request which normally takes two weeks for a two hour library period. Petitioner has notified Institutional Administrators of pending filing deadlines and a need to access the law library in order to complete these pleading due to both pending deadlines and the present problems with the installation of the new law library computer system.

Wherefore petitioner establishes good causes for this Justice to extend this filing by sixty (60) days. Petitioner thus prays.
