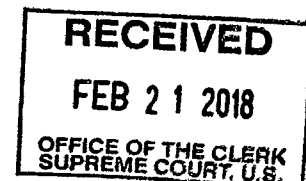
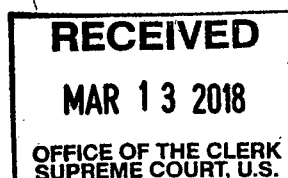
I respectfully request an extension of time to file my motion for writ of certiorari to the Supreme Court. My appellate motion was denied for lack of of a substantial showing, on November 22, 2017. Due to numerous facts and issues I was not able to timely file anything but a barebones document. (The clerk of the appellate court incorrectly advised me or I misunderstood the time I had to submit the supplemental filing with the documents.)

Since I am a pro se defendant and totally unfamiliar with Court proceeding, deadlines, protocol, et al, I ask the Court's benevolence and request a 60 day extension to file a petition for writ of certiorari with pertinent documents. I believe this request would extend the due date from 2/22/18 to 4/24/18.

The delay is due to numerous family health issues, to include a bedridden child, a 94 year father, as well as my own disability, needing immediate medical intervention, and other concerns such as, recovery from hurricane Irma, and caregivers out with their own medical needs and concerns.

I beg for the Courts benevolence in granting this request.

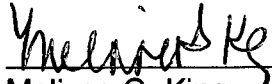
I believe the filing will be able to show significant denial of constitutional rights, including split circuit decisions and application, and issues that are far reaching numerous matters currently of the public concern.
