Dear Mr. Bickell:

I am Counsel of Record for Respondents in the above-captioned case. On October 12, 2018, a petition for certiorari was docketed in this case. On November 29, 2018, the Court requested a response. Unless the Court grants an extension, the response would be due on January 2, 2019. For the reasons that follow, and pursuant to Rule 30.4, I respectfully request an extension of 30 days, to and including February 1, 2019.

I have several pressing business obligations during these upcoming weeks, including filing a Reply Brief and Cross-Appellees Opposition Brief—as Counsel for the Plaintiffs/Appellants—in the Indiana Court of Appeals, a brief that is due on December 21, 2018.
