I represent respondent in the above-referenced petition for certiorari. A response is currently due on February 4, 2019. Respondent respectfully requests that the time to file a response be extended by 30 days, to and including March 6, 2019. The extension is warranted because the undersigned counsel, Neal Katyal, was recently retained as counsel of record and must familiarize himself with the issues and record. In addition, Mr. Katyal has upcoming filings and arguments in several other matters that will require his attention over the next several weeks. Among other matters, Mr. Katyal expects to present oral argument in *United Healthcare of New York, Inc. v. Vullo*, No. 18-2583 (2d Cir.) on February 8, file a petition for certiorari in *McKinney v. Arizona* by February 21, *see* No. 18A580, file opening merits briefs in *Fort Bend County v. Davis*, No. 18-525, and *McDonough v. Smith*, No. 18-485, by February 25, file a reply brief in *Maryland-National Capital Park & Planning Commission v. American Humanist Association*, No. 18-18, by February 20, and present oral argument in *Maryland-National Capital Park & Planning Commission* on February 27. Given these commitments, an extension of time is warranted to permit Mr. Katyal to prepare a response that fully analyzes and responds to the arguments raised in the petition for certiorari.
