We recently learned that the petition for a writ of certiorari in this matter, which was docketed August 1, 2019, contains a minor cite checking error.

On page 15, the petition describes the position taken by the United States in briefing before the Federal Circuit. The petition states:



The second set of internal quotation marks is incorrect and should not have been included. Instead the brief should read:
