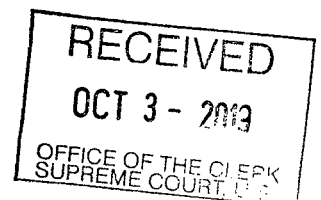

PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI

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QUESTION PRESENTED

Were petitioner's civil rights violated upon being baptized illegally pursuant to the Fourteenth Amendment of the United States Constitution and Exodus chapter 20 verse 4 through 6, in reference that there is no evidence to verify that Jesus Christ died on a cross?

JURISDICTION

The Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals entered judgment on July 24, 2019. The court denied the appeal. This court has jurisdiction pursuant to 28 U.S.C. Section 1254(1). See Public Law 84-140 dated July 30, 1956.



STATUTES AND CONSTITUTIONAL PROVISIONS INVOLVED

United States Congress made informal contract with God Jehovah that is "In God We Trust". The contract involved United States General Public for obedience to God Jehovah's law in Exodus chapter 20 verse

4 through 7. Respondents defaulted and breached U.S. Congress' law which is tort for the purpose to establish court's jurisdiction. United States Congress law to insert **"In God We Trust"** on United States currency constitute that United States Congress laws are not above God Jehovah's law and God's law shall supersede men's laws. See Public Law 84-140 dated July 30, 1956.

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INTRODUCTION AND STATEMENT OF THE CASE

The issue presented in this case involves petitioner's civil rights pursuant to the Fourteenth Amendment of the United States Constitution regarding respondents' illegally baptizing petitioner in violation of God's law under Exodus chapter 20 verse 4 through 7. The violation is that Priest used graven image of Christ Jesus' body on a cross for the purpose to make the baptized person official before God. See statement case at App. 11-13. There is no cited law for violation for illegally baptizing persons in reference to using graven images but the Roman Catholic Church defaulted of God's law which should suffice to bar the catholic church from any protection under the First Amendment of the United States Constitution using the authority of the doctrine of clean hands. Concealment of violation of Exodus chapter 20 verse 4-7, constitute tolling statute of limitations. American Legion v. American Humanist Association Supreme Court Case Docket No. 17-1717 (2019)

REASONS FOR GRANTING THE PETITION

- (a) God Jehovah has been very good to the United States of America.
- (b) Petitioner's desire is to comply with God Jehovah's law at Exodus chapter 20 verse 4 through 7.
- (c) Without any doubt, the Roman Catholic church have committed fraudulent in baptizing persons illegally by using carved image of Christ Jesus' body.

CONCLUSION

The facts about the cross is misleading the whole world based on that there is no legal evidence that Christ Jesus expired on a cross. If the Court deny petitioner's petition constitute that court disapproved Jesus's words in Matthew chapter 22 verse 36 and 37. There is no need for oral argument because God's laws supersede men's laws. Officials of the catholic church are unforgivable for worst crime in United States history based on priest's sex abuse crisis and Pope's disobedient to God Jehovah's laws. Because petitioner is over 94 years of age, is good reason for requesting court to expedite petition.
