Respondent Warden's counsel respectfully requests a 30-day extension of time for filing his brief in opposition to the petition for writ of certiorari. Undersigned counsel is currently operating under numerous competing deadlines in various other state and federal habeas corpus cases. Most notably, undersigned counsel has been working on an appellee's brief in the Eleventh Circuit Court of Appeals in *Smith v. Warden*, Case No. 19-12877. Additionally, undersigned counsel has numerous other deadlines in state and federal habeas corpus cases over the next few weeks that require his attention.
