Re: *Amazon.com, Inc., et al. v. Bernadean Rittmann, et al.*, No. 20-622

Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 30.4, Respondents Bernadean Rittmann, et al., respectfully move for an extension of time for filing their response to Petitioners Amazon.com Inc. and Amazon Logistics Inc. (hereinafter “Amazon’s”) Petition for Writ of Certiorari in *Rittmann v. Amazon.com Inc., et al.*, Docket No. 20-622, until January 13, 2021. Amazon filed its Petition for Writ of Certiorari on November 4, 2020, and it was docketed on November 9, 2020. The response is currently due on December 9, 2020.

Counsel has diligently attempted to meet the Court’s deadline to file an opposition to Petitioner’s Writ of Certiorari; however, due to the Thanksgiving holiday and other conflicting professional obligations in the coming weeks, counsel requires additional time in which to craft its response. In particular, counsel has several appellate briefs due in the coming weeks before the First and Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals in *Cunningham v. Lyft Inc.*, First Cir. No. 20-1373 and *Rogers v. Lyft Inc.*, Ninth Cir. No. 20-15689. An extension will allow counsel to meet these obligations and also to file a response that adequately addresses the points raised in the petition for certiorari. To most effectively do so, and to accommodate counsel’s personal scheduling conflicts during the holiday season, the Respondents request an additional 35 days to file their response. No prejudice will result from the requested extension, and Amazon has indicated that it does not oppose this request.
