**MOTION FOR LEAVE TO DISPENSE WITH  
PREPARATION OF A JOINT APPENDIX**

---

Pursuant to Rule 26.8 of the Rules of this Court, Petitioner Axon Enterprise, Inc. respectfully moves for leave to dispense with the requirement of a joint appendix in this case. Respondents agree that a joint appendix is not necessary.

This case presents the purely legal question whether the FTC Act impliedly strips federal district courts of jurisdiction over constitutional challenges to the Federal Trade Commission's structure, procedures, and existence. The opinions of the lower courts on that legal question, as well as relevant constitutional and statutory provisions, are reproduced in the appendix to the petition for a writ of certiorari. The parties agree that no other portion of the record merits special attention that warrants the preparation and expense of a joint appendix, and that preparation of a joint appendix would not materially assist the Court in its consideration of the case.

For the foregoing reasons, the motion to dispense with the preparation of a joint appendix should be granted.
