File Brief in Opposition to Petition for a Writ of Certiorari

Dear Mr. Harris:

Respondent Douglas J. Peterson, Attorney General of the State of Nebraska, and Respondent Continental Resources respectfully request an extension of time to file their briefs in opposition to the petition for a writ of certiorari in this case. Counsel for Respondent Continental Resources has authorized General Peterson to speak for Continental Resources in this letter. Respondents ask that the deadline for the briefs in opposition be extended from October 28, 2022, to December 2, 2022.

This extension request is justified for the following reasons. First, four amicus briefs have been filed in support of the petition in this case, and Respondents need more time to review and analyze the arguments in those briefs. Second, Respondents' counsel have had many other pressing litigation tasks and deadlines demanding their time over the last few weeks, and they will continue to have more throughout the next few weeks. In particular, General Peterson's counsel is involved in expedited litigation concerning the Secretary of Education's decision to cancel nearly a half trillion dollars in student loan debt. *See Nebraska v. Biden*, No. 4:22-cv-1040-HEA (E.D. Mo.).

Petitioner's counsel, Christina M. Martin, consents to this extension request.
