Dear Mr. Harris,

1. Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 30(4), Respondents respectfully request an extension of time to file their brief in opposition.

2. On September 23, 2022, the Petitioner City of Ocala, Florida filed a petition for writ of certiorari.

3. Respondents' brief in opposition to a petition for a writ of certiorari are currently due October 24, 2022.

4. Additional time is necessary for Respondents' counsel to adequately respond to the writ of certiorari. The undersigned is solely responsible for researching, drafting, and editing Respondents' brief in opposition.

5. In addition to working full time at the American Humanist Association as senior counsel, the undersigned is also a part-time lawyer for the Nonhuman Rights Project and has litigation obligations to fulfill for that position over the next month.
