Dear Mr. Harris:

A responsive brief in this death penalty case is due April 6, 2023. Respondent respectfully requests a thirty-five-day extension of the present deadline, up to and including May 11, 2023. This is the first request for an extension in this case by counsel for Respondent. The extension request is not sought for an improper purpose, including harassment or unnecessary delay. Rather, counsel has recently filed responsive pleadings in *Edwards v. Lumpkin*, No. 3:23-cv-18 (S.D. Tex. Mar. 20, 2023) and *Sweeney v. Lumpkin*, No. 4:22-CV-893-O (N.D. Tex. Mar. 22, 2023.), and she is preparing a non-extendable responsive brief in *Polasek v. State of Texas*, No. 14-22-00302-CR (Tex. App.—Houston [14th Dist.]), due April 5, 2023. Counsel has also devoted a large amount of time in her supervisory role within her division. Consequently, counsel has been unable to complete her additional review of the record and researching the issues to draft a responsive brief in the instant case, and additional time is needed to do so. The undersigned conferred with Petitioner's counsel who stated he is not opposed to this requested extension. Thank you for your consideration.
