RE: Kelly v US District Court Eastern District of PA/Supreme Court Rule 12.6 Notice

Dear Honorable Clerk of Court:

Supreme Court Rule 12.6 provides:

"All parties to the proceeding in the court whose judgment is sought to be reviewed are deemed parties entitled to file documents in this Court, unless the petitioner notifies the Clerk of this Court in writing of the petitioner's belief that one or more of the parties below have no interest in the outcome of the petition. A copy of such notice shall be served as required by Rule 29 on all parties to the proceeding below. A party noted as no longer interested may remain a party by notifying the Clerk promptly, with service on the other parties, of an intention to remain a party. All parties other than the petitioner are considered respondents, but any respondent who supports the position of a petitioner shall meet the petitioner's time schedule for filing documents, with the following exception: A response of a party aligned with petitioner below who supports granting the petition shall be filed within 30 days after the case is placed on the docket, and that time will not be extended. Counsel for such respondent shall ensure that counsel of record for all parties receive notice of its intention to file a brief in support within 20 days after the case is placed on the docket. A respondent not aligned with petitioner below who supports granting the petition, or a respondent aligned with petitioner below who takes the position that the petition should be denied, is not subject to the notice requirement and may file a response within the time otherwise provided by Rule 15.3. Parties who file no document will not qualify for any relief from this Court. "

I write to provide notice that I believe the appellee the United States District Court of the Eastern District Court of Pennsylvania has no interest in the outcome of the petition. The Court is the trial court and is a party in name only since there is no adversarial party other than the trial Court itself in a reciprocal disciplinary case whose orders are the subject of the appeal below.

I respectfully request to being excused to paying for postage and copies to the US District Court of the Eastern District of PA.

I respectfully request the US District Court of the Eastern of PA file its response to this notice within 20 days of the date on this letter is filed, and if it does not respond that I respectfully be granted relief from filing documents with Appellee, the US District Court of the Eastern District of PA.

The original disciplinary Order prevents me from working at the profession of my choice. I am impoverished, and additional costs relating to litigation are so great as to prevent me access to this court to exercise my First Amendment right to petition to prevent irreparable injury in terms of not only loss of property interests in licenses to practice law but Constitutional protected First Amendment right to private religious belief, exercise of religious belief, speech, association, 5th Amendment right to a fair proceeding, invoked right against involuntary servitude, and other rights and claims. US Amend I, V, XIII


