MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

The Petitioner, Taquarius K. Ford, Pro se, hereby presents a request for this Honorable Court's consideration. I humbly requests a 30-Day Extension to file a Motion for Certiorari with the Supreme Court. The Petitioner's Motion for Certificate of Appealability was denied by the Ninth Circuit on August 7th, 2023. Starting the 90-Day Certiorari file time. The Petitioner was transported by the U.S. Marshal Service on August 16, 2023 to another correctional facility. The Petitioner was in transport for twenty-three days, arriving on September 8th, 2023, wherein he awaited his property with regards to his legal files specific to his Certiorari Application. This delay in transport hampered Petitioner's 90-Day prescribed limit to file his Certiorari. This Honorable Court has the authority to grant this Motion pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 13.5. (See Appendix A, Ninth Circuit Denial along with day Petitioner recieved said denial.)

Mr. Ford presents the following:

- 1) This is Mr. Ford's only request for an extension of time.
- 2) Mr. Ford is a Pro se litigant with no formal training in the legal field.
- 3) Mr. Ford is confined to a correctional facility where, for obvious reasons, has limited access to legal resources. Yet, now has all appropriate documents needed to prepare his Certiorari.
- 4) This motion is filed in the interest of justice, and not for the purpose of delay. The United States will not be prejudiced by a 30-day extension of time.

The Petitioner will exercise diligence by timely filing Certiorari with this Honorable Supreme Court.

Wherefore, the above premises considered, the Petitioner most humbly request this Honorable Court grant this extension.
