12. Additional Information Supporting Inability to Pay Costs

Petitioner respectfully states that although he maintains ownership interests in real property, the income reported from such properties reflects **net proceeds after substantial property-related expenses**, including mortgages, taxes, insurance, maintenance, utilities, repairs, and related carrying costs. Such properties generate only modest disposable income after expenses and are heavily encumbered.

Petitioner presently maintains only limited liquid savings and checking funds, totaling approximately **\$3,200**, available for ordinary living expenses and litigation-related costs.

Petitioner previously complied with this Court's booklet-format requirements in connection with his Petition for Writ of Certiorari, incurring approximately **\$6,700 in printing and production costs** in good-faith adherence to this Court's procedural requirements. Those expenditures materially reduced available liquid resources.

Petitioner further continues to bear ongoing litigation-related obligations, including legal proceedings involving the City of New York, and contributes financial support toward household obligations associated with a South African family residence held in a family trust, which is not personally owned by Petitioner for purposes of this declaration.

Petitioner respectfully submits that, notwithstanding ownership interests in real property, current liquid resources and disposable cash flow do not permit renewed booklet-format compliance without substantial financial hardship. The estimated value of certain real property is materially affected by ongoing municipal enforcement actions, vacate orders, fines, repair burdens, and litigation, substantially reducing practical liquidity and realizable value.

Pursuant to Rule 39.1 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the United States


I, **Daryll B. Jones**, declare under penalty of perjury pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746 that the following is true and correct:

1. I am the Petitioner in the above-captioned matter and submit this declaration in support of my Motion for Leave to Proceed *In Forma Pauperis* pursuant to Rule 39 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the United States.
2. I respectfully state that I presently lack the financial ability to bear the extraordinary expense associated with producing forty booklet-format copies required for filing a Petition for Rehearing under Rule 44.2.
3. I previously complied with this Court's booklet-format requirements in connection with my Petition for Writ of Certiorari, incurring substantial printing, production, and filing-related expenses in good-faith compliance with the Court's procedural rules. Those expenditures materially reduced my available savings and financial flexibility.
4. I presently maintain only limited liquid savings, approximately **\$1,500**, available for ordinary living and litigation-related expenses.
5. My present monthly income is modest and primarily derived from a salary associated with my nonprofit ministry, **Global Justice Ministries**, which itself is supported principally through charitable contributions and modest proceeds associated with real estate operations.
6. While I maintain interests in real property, such properties generate only modest net income after mortgages, taxes, insurance, maintenance, repair obligations, and substantial litigation-related expenses. Such assets are not readily liquid and do not presently provide sufficient disposable income to absorb the extraordinary cost of renewed Supreme Court booklet-format production.
7. I also continue to bear substantial carrying costs associated with real property obligations, ongoing legal expenses, and litigation matters, including ongoing proceedings involving the City of New York.
8. My residence in South Africa is not income-producing and serves as my family residence.

9. Household finances are maintained primarily separately, and I continue to contribute financial support toward family and business-related obligations.
10. Despite these limitations, I have acted diligently and in good faith to comply with this Court's procedural requirements, including prior paid filings, corrective submissions, and timely efforts to comply with instructions from the Office of the Clerk.
11. I respectfully submit that my request to proceed *In Forma Pauperis* is made in good faith, not for purposes of delay, and solely to preserve meaningful access to this Court for review of substantial constitutional questions.
