

Dear Clerk:

I am the current counsel of record for the Respondents in this case. Petitioners filed their petition for a writ of certiorari on June 2, 2025, seeking review of a decision of the Maine Supreme Judicial Court. On July 1, 2025, Respondents submitted a waiver form, foregoing filing of a response unless requested to do so by the Court. On July 16, 2025, the petition was distributed for conference. On July 30, 2025, Respondents were informed that the Court had requested a response be filed. Respondents' response is currently due on August 29, 2025.

Pursuant to Rule 30.4, Respondents respectfully request that the time for filing a response be extended by four weeks, to and including September 26, 2025.

This is Respondents' first request for an extension of time to file a response. Good cause exists for the requested extension. Respondents' counsel of record in this matter, including undersigned counsel, had represented Respondents in all State court proceedings before the Maine Superior Court and Maine Supreme Judicial Court. However, neither of Respondents' counsel of record in the state court proceedings are currently members of the Bar of this Court. An extension of time will allow Respondents to engage counsel who is admitted in this Court and who can prepare and file a response on Respondents' behalf. Moreover, an extension of time would better enable preparation of a response that would be most helpful to the Court.


