MOTION FOR LEAVE TO PROCEED *IN FORMA PAUPERIS*

Capital case

Through undersigned counsel, Petitioner Lucious Boyd asks leave to file the attached petition for writ of certiorari without prepayment of costs and to proceed *in forma pauperis*.

Petitioner has previously been granted leave to proceed *in forma pauperis* in the following courts: the Florida Supreme Court; the Circuit Court of the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit in and for Broward County, Florida; the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida; and the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit. Petitioner's affidavit or declaration is not attached because the court below appointed counsel in the current proceeding under Criminal Justice Act (18 U.S.C. § 3006A), and by operation of 11th Cir. R.24-1,

Capital Collateral Regional Counsel–South is a Florida state agency statutorily responsible for providing legal representation in both state and federal capital postconviction proceedings to persons convicted and sentenced to death in Florida. Part IV, Ch. 27, FLA. STAT. (1994). Capital Collateral Regional Counsel–South has represented Petitioner as counsel of record in his postconviction proceedings since September 9, 2005.
