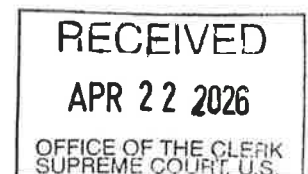
RE: Request for extension of time to file response to petition
Samsung SDI Company, Limited v. Shawn Peters
S. Ct. No. 25-1156

Dear Mr. Harris:

I am counsel for the Respondent, Shawn Peters, in this case. Petitioner Samsung SDI Co., Ltd., filed their petition for a writ of certiorari on April 3, 2026. According to the online docket and pursuant to Rule 15.3 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the United States, a response is currently due on May 7, 2026. Pursuant to Rule 30.4, and based on Petitioner's unwillingness to stipulate to a full 30-day extension, Respondent respectfully requests that the time for filing a response be extended by 19 days, to and including May 26, 2026.

This is Respondent's first request for an extension of time to file a response. Good cause exists for the requested extension. First, Respondent, though not currently a member of this Court, is in the process of obtaining additional sponsors and wet signatures in order to present a timely application in advance of filing Respondent's response. Second, I represent clients with multiple pending matters that will consume considerable time, including extensive trial and pre-motions in a matter set for trial in early May 2026, two appellant's opening briefs in the California Courts of Appeal, and significant law and motion deadlines over the next three weeks. Finally, I was unavailable when Petitioner filed their petition on April 3, 2026, returning to the office on April 14, 2026, and would respectfully request additional time to analyze the Petition, prepare any necessary Brief in Opposition, and ensure a thorough response.

Accordingly, Respondent respectfully requests that the time for filing a response to the petition for writ of certiorari be extended by 19 days, to and including May 26, 2026. On April 14, 2026, I asked counsel for Petitioner for their

position on a 30-day extension that is normally granted in the first instance by the Clerk. Petitioner would only agree to a 19-day extension, hence the time limit requested herein. Respondent reserves the right to request a further extension from the Court, should it become necessary.
