Dear Mr. Harris,

I write to follow up on my letter of September 11, 2026, concerning the dismissal of *Genalo v. G.M.*, No. 25-886, which presented a similar constitutional issue to that briefed in *Putra*. The Government has now filed a petition for certiorari that presents the same constitutional issues as those presented in *G.M.* See Petition for Certiorari before Judgment 27–30, *Genalo v. D.C.*, No. 26-379 (Sup. Ct. Sept. 21, 2026); see also Letter from D. John Sauer, Solicitor Gen., to Scott S. Harris, Clerk, U.S. Supreme Court 2 (Sept. 11, 2026), <https://perma.cc/DFX7-6287>.

For the reasons stated by Respondents in *Putra* and *Rhoney* and Petitioners in *Buenrostro-Mendez*, if this Court grants certiorari in *D.C.*, it should grant only on the statutory issue presented in *Buenrostro-Mendez* and *Rhoney*. See Br. in Opp'n 3–4, 18–23, *Putra v. Lopez-Campos*, No. 25-1415 (Sup. Ct. Aug. 24, 2026); Resp. to Cert. Pet. 18, *Rhoney v. Barbosa da Cunha*, No. 26-104 (Sup. Ct. Aug. 21, 2026); Cert. Pet. 29–32, *Buenrostro-Mendez v. Blanche*, No. 26-43 (Sup. Ct. July 2, 2026).
