Re: Dondero v. Jernigan, No. 25-355; Rule 32(3) letter in support of petition for certiorari

Dear Mr. Harris:

Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 32(3), petitioners James Dondero et al. respectfully ask the clerk's office to lodge two novels—*He Watches All My Paths* and *Hedging Death*—written and published by Chief Bankruptcy Judge Stacey G. Jernigan, as referred to in the petition for certiorari filed on September 22, 2025. *See* Pet. at 6 nn. 5 & 6. The petitioners' appendix includes excerpts of the novels, which are discussed at length in the petition and reflect several similarities between the characters in the novels and the parties and proceedings before the bankruptcy judge. We refrained from including the full text of the novels out of concern for the author's intellectual-property rights, but the novels are available for purchase so we are providing copies for the Court as it considers the petition.

We are also attaching to this letter the media advisory for the bankruptcy judge's new novel, which shows the extent to which the bankruptcy judge is using the instant controversy to promote her out-of-court writings. *See* Exhibit A; *see also* Pet. at 12 n.23. We were unable to include the media advisory in the appendix due to formatting issues, but it is available online at <http://bit.ly/48dS9ZF>.
