Dear Mr. Harris:

I am counsel of record for the petitioners in this case. On February 5, the Court extended the time to file the petitioners' brief on the merits to and including April 13, 2026, and the time to file respondents' brief on the merits to and including June 22, 2026. Having conferred with counsel for the respondents, I write to respectfully request that the Court further extend these deadlines by ten days each, as follows:

Brief for the petitioners (and joint appendix): April 23, 2026

Brief for the respondents: July 2, 2026

This schedule would permit this case to be heard during the Court's October 2026 sitting. Under this Court's rules, petitioners' reply brief would be due 30 days later, which is more than 10 days before the earliest possible argument during the October 2026 sitting. Counsel for the respondents does not oppose this request.

There is good cause for the requested extension because I have been dealing with an unexpected personal medical issue, and my colleagues and I have several intervening obligations that would make it difficult to prepare the brief absent the extension. These obligations include, for example: an opposition to a petition for certiorari in this Court in *Nwauzor v. GEO Group*, No. 25-828, on April 10; an opening brief and appendix due in the Seventh Circuit in *Xu Lun v. Milwaukee Electric-Tool Corp.*, No. 25-3347, on April 10; a reply brief due in the Tenth Circuit in *Shaffer v. Toyota*, No. 25-6115, on April 13; a reply brief due in the Eighth Circuit in *MMIC v. OB/GYN*, No. 25-1758, on April 16; an appellee brief due in the First Circuit in *Pizza Hazel v. American Express*, No. 25-2007, on April 27; and an opening brief and appendix due in the Fourth Circuit in *Carefirst of Maryland v. Johnson & Johnson*, No. 26-1248, on April 28.
