I write on behalf of Mr. Louis Chandler, Respondent in the above-captioned case. The Court docketed the petition for a writ of certiorari in this matter on October 31, 2025. On December 1, 2025, Respondent filed a waiver of its right to respond. On December 9, 2025, the Court requested a response. The response is currently due on January 8, 2026.
