Before Haynes, Higginson, and Oldham, *Circuit Judges*. Per Curiam:*

Demario D. Henderson pleaded guilty to possessing a firearm after a felony conviction, and he was sentenced to 69 months of imprisonment, to be followed by three years of supervised release. On appeal, he renews his contention that 18 U.S.C. § 922(g)(1) violates the Second Amendment, on its face, under the test set forth in *New York State Rifle & Pistol Ass'n*, *Inc. v.*

No. 24-30718

Bruen, 597 U.S. 1 (2022). The Government has moved without opposition for summary affirmance or, alternatively, for an extension of time to file its brief.

Henderson is correct that his arguments are foreclosed. See United States v. Diaz, 116 F.4th 458, 471-72 (5th Cir. 2024), petition for cert. filed (U.S. Feb. 18, 2025) (No. 24-6625). Because the Government's position "is clearly right as a matter of law so that there can be no substantial question as to the outcome of the case," summary affirmance is appropriate. Groendyke Transp., Inc. v. Davis, 406 F.2d 1158, 1162 (5th Cir. 1969).

Accordingly, the motion for summary affirmance is GRANTED, and the judgment of the district court is AFFIRMED. The Government's alternative motion for an extension of time is DENIED as moot.

IMPRISONMENT

The defendant is hereby committed to the custody of the Federal Bureau of Prisons to be imprisoned for a total term of: 69 month(s) as to count 1. On February 14, 2024, a federal arrest warrant was issued for the Defendant. On February 27, 2024, the Defendant initially appeared before U.S. Magistrate Judge, Mark L. Hornsby, via Writ from Caddo Correctional Center in Shreveport, Louisiana. The Defendant has been incarcerated since July 22, 2023, and he was remanded to the custody of the U.S. Marshals Service on February 27, 2024 where he has since remained. The Court notes the potential of "anticipated state sentences" in the First Judicial District Court for Caddo Parish in Shreveport, Louisiana, under Docket No. 396558 and 397094, that represent relevant conduct. Pursuant to USSG §5Gl.3(c), it is the Order of the Court that this sentence shall run concurrently with any state sentence imposed in the matter from the First Judicial District Court for Caddo Parish in Shreveport, Louisiana. Further, the Court notes the potential of "anticipated sentences" in the First Judicial District Court in Shreveport, Louisiana, under Docket Nos. 396557 and 397093 that do not represent relevant conduct. Pursuant to USSG §5Gl.3(d) and 18 U.S.C. §3584, it is the Order of the Court that this sentence shall run consecutively with any state sentence imposed in the matters from the First Judicial District Court in Shreveport, Louisiana. Should the Defendant be entitled to credit for any of the time the Defendant has already spent in custody, the Federal Bureau of Prisons will make that determination.

STANDARD CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION (SC)

As part of your supervised release, you must comply with the following standard conditions of supervision. These conditions are imposed because they establish the basic expectations for your behavior while on supervision and identify the minimum tools needed by probation officers to keep informed, report to the court about, and bring about improvements in your conduct and condition.

- You must report to the probation office in the federal judicial district where you are authorized to reside within 72 hours of your release from imprisonment, unless the probation officer instructs you to report to a different probation office or within a different time frame.
- After initially reporting to the probation office, you will receive instructions from the court or the probation officer about how and when you must report to the probation 2. officer, and you must report to the probation officer as instructed.
- You must not knowingly leave the federal judicial district where you are authorized to reside without first getting permission from the court or the probation officer. 3.
- You must answer truthfully the questions asked by your probation officer.
- You must live at a place approved by the probation officer. If you plan to change where you live or anything about your living arrangements (such as the people you live with), you must notify the probation officer at least 10 days before the change. If notifying the probation officer in advance is not possible due to unanticipated circumstances, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours of becoming aware of a change or expected change.
- You must allow the probation officer to visit you at any time at your home or elsewhere, and you must permit the probation officer to take any items prohibited by the conditions of your supervision that he or she observes in plain view.
- You must work full time (at least 30 hours per week) at a lawful type of employment, unless the probation officer excuses you from doing so. If you do not have full-time employment you must try to find full-time employment, unless the probation officer excuses you from doing so. If you plan to change where you work or anything about your work (such as your position or your job responsibilities), you must notify the probation officer at least 10 days before the change. If notifying the probation officer at least 10 days in advance is not possible due to unanticipated circumstances, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours of becoming aware of a change or expected change.
- You must not communicate or interact with someone you know is engaged in criminal activity. If you know someone has been convicted of a felony, you must not knowingly communicate or interact with that person without first getting the permission of the probation officer.
- If you are arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours. 9.
- You must not own, possess, or have access to a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or dangerous weapon (i.e., anything that was designed, or was modified for, the specific purpose of causing bodily injury or death to another person such as nunchakus or tasers).
- You must not act or make any agreement with a law enforcement agency to act as a confidential human source or informant without first getting the permission of the 11.
- If the probation officer determines that you pose a risk to another person (including an organization), the probation officer may require you to notify the person about the 12. risk and you must comply with that instruction. The probation officer may contact the person and confirm that you have notified the person about the risk.

- 1.
