PETITION FOR REHEARIING

The Plaintiff, Magdoulén A. Sawires, respectfully requests this Honorable Court to grant a petition for rehearing of its Order of November 10, 2025, denying the Petition for a Writ of Certiorari

REASONS FOR GRANTING REHEARING

1- The issues before the court involve more than the non-renewal of an annual employment contract. The plaintiff was unlawfully separated from employment before the expiration of the existing contract, and the separation occurred without the plaintiff's knowledge or consent. Furthermore, the defendant rejected the plaintiff's previously submitted resignation, which should have constituted the formal conclusion of the plaintiff's employment. These actions, taken together, demonstrate an improper and unauthorized termination. Moreover, if any media or videos were submitted by the defender in the lower court, they would never be served properly, and the plaintiff would never receive them.

2- This conduct is not isolated. The Department of Education, including associated Boards of Education, has engaged in similar actions toward the plaintiff in the past, (more explaining including in number 4).

3- The plaintiff seeks not only reconsideration of the Order issued on November 1, 2025, but also requests that the Court consolidate this matter with the pending related case in the lower court, Docket No. MID-L-1790-25. Consolidation would allow the Court to review the full factual history and consider the complete context of the plaintiff's claims and opening the plaintiff FBI file.

4- Some of the plaintiff's events:

A- Between 2005 and 2010, two microchips were inserted into my body without my knowledge or consent. Even RWJ Hamilton subsequently withdrew a medical certificate related to this issue, still, the plaintiff (Magdoulén A. Sawires) continues to experience physical and personal difficulties as a result.

B- In 2013, The plaintiff's husband was killed and got replaced by an individual copy.

C- In 2015, The plaintiff was dismissed from a study program in Mercer County community college after the plaintiff declined to comply with a professor's directive as it was unlawful.

D- In 2016, The plaintiff was removed from a second academic program at the same institution without being provided any explanation or clear reasons.

E- In 2017, The plaintiff was terminated from the Head Start program at Burlington TWP, NJ after refusing directives from a supervisor (The supervisor conflicted with the plaintiff's religious beliefs as the supervisor directed the plaintiff to change her belief).

F- In 2018, The plaintiff's employment with Paterson Public Schools terminated the job before the contract ends without the plaintiff's knowledge despite the fact that The plaintiff had submitted her resignation.

G- In 2019, the Plaintiff job got terminated from the Fairview Board of education just for no reason. The plaintiff submitted her resignation on time, still, the district terminated the job.

H- In 2020, The Plaintiff employment with West Newark Public Schools was terminated even though the plaintiff submitted the resignation in a timely manner.

I- In 2021, the Biden administration inserted a third microchip in the plaintiff body without her knowledge.

J- In 2021, The plaintiff's employment with the Elizabeth Board of Education was terminated before the end of my annual contract, without prior notice or investigation.

K- In 2024, the plaintiff's three children were kidnapped and held in Area 51 after the US government inserted microchips in their bodies, as the government knew that the kids had different natural bodies and The US government replaced the kids by individual copies at the plaintiff's home.


