ORDER ACCEPTING FINDINGS,
CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF
UNITED STATES MAGISTRATE JUDGE


Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. section 636, the Court has reviewed the Complaint, all of the records herein, and the Report and Recommendation of a United States Magistrate Judge, to which no objections were filed. However, the Court construes Plaintiff's Ex Parte Applications for Temporary Restraining Order (Dkt. Nos. 82, 91, 96, 102), Motions for Review and Reconsideration re Ex Parte Applications for Temporary Restraining Order (Dkt. Nos. 88, 92, 98) and accompanying declarations and attachments (Dkt. Nos. 83-85, 89-90, 93-95, 99-101) as objections to the R&R. After having made a de novo determination of the portions of the Report and Recommendation to which Objections were directed, the Court concurs with and accepts the findings and conclusions of the

1 Magistrate Judge. In sum, Plaintiff's Objections do not cause the
2 Court to reconsider its decision to accept the Magistrate Judge's
3 conclusions and recommendations. Accordingly, the Court concurs
4 with and accepts the findings and conclusions of the Magistrate
5 Judge in the Report and Recommendation.

7 IT IS ORDERED that (1) Plaintiff's Ex Parte Applications for
8 entry of default against the State of California as well as his
9 Applications for a Temporary Restraining Order (Dkt. Nos. 70, 72,
10 75, 82, 91, 96 and 102) are DENIED; (2) Plaintiff's motions for
11 review and reconsideration (Dkt. Nos. 88, 92 and 98) are DENIED;
12 (3) Defendant Starbucks's Request for Judicial Notice (Dkt. No.
13 16) is GRANTED; (4) the Motions to Dismiss filed by Defendant
14 Starbucks and Defendant Commissioner Rubin (Dkt. Nos. 15 and 26)
15 are GRANTED; (5) Plaintiff's federal claims (Claims One through
16 Three) are DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE; and (6) Plaintiff's state law
17 claims (Claims Four and Five) are DISMISSED WITHOUT PREJUDICE.

21 Order and the Magistrate Judge's Report and Recommendation on
22 Plaintiff and counsel for Defendants.
