ORDER APPOINTING COUNSEL AND GRANTING MOTION TO PROCEED IN FORMA PAUPERIS

Petitioner Clyde Wendell Smith, a State prisoner under a sentence of death, has filed a motion for the appointment of counsel and has requested to proceed *in forma pauperis* in connection with these federal habeas corpus proceedings. Upon due consideration, the Court finds that the motion should be granted.

Application to Proceed In Forma Pauperis

Smith's application [1] for leave to proceed in forma pauperis is **GRANTED**.¹

Motion for Appointment of Counsel

The Court finds that Smith is entitled to the appointment of counsel under the provisions of 18 U.S.C. § 3599. *See also McFarland v. Scott*, 512 U.S. 849 (1994). Therefore, Smith's motion [1] for appointment of counsel is **GRANTED**. The Court finds that attorney David Calder qualifies for appointment as lead counsel as set forth in 18 U.S.C. § 3599(c). The Court further finds that good cause exists for additionally appointing attorney Marie Donnelly as counsel of record in this cause under 18 U.S.C. § 3599(d).

¹ The Court notes that Smith's counsel has requested but has not yet obtained Smith's inmate account information. *See* Doc. #1 at 6. However, inasmuch as Smith has been incarcerated since 1992 and has declared through counsel that he has no income or assets, the Court finds that Smith's request to proceed as a pauper should be preliminarily granted. Counsel should file Smith's verified inmate account information upon receipt of same.

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Accordingly, David Calder and Marie Donnelly are hereby appointed counsel of record

for Smith in this habeas corpus proceeding. Appointed counsel are entitled to compensation in

accordance with Volume VII, Chapter II, of the Guide to Judicial Policies and Procedures, which

Counsel is directed to read along with the instructions for form CJA 30 in order to ensure proper

compensation for time and expenses incurred. A copy of this Order, along with CJA 30 forms

shall be sent to:

Smith shall file and serve on the Mississippi Attorney General his federal habeas corpus

petition on or before the limitations deadline imposed by the Antiterrorism and Effective Death

Penalty Act of 1996. See 28 U.S.C. § 2244(d). The petition shall include all grounds for federal

habeas corpus relief that Smith wishes this Court to consider in connection with his capital

murder conviction and death sentence. The Court will issue a scheduling order once the petition

has been filed.
