

### STATEMENT OF THE CASE

The State of OR doesn't allow me to request Islamic books from the library, perform Friday prayer with the brothers while in SEG, or wear my state cap as a koofti because they make us buy them from California. ODOC only allows us to file 4 grievances a month. Everything else gets denied unless its PREA. I was assaulted by C/O T. Lancell in Jan. 2025, I filed a grievance on it, it was denied cuz the rule says 4 grievances a month.

We get denied proper winter clothes in SEG. @ E.O.C.I. we don't get any thermos, hat, sweater, or real shoes. They make us go to Yard in the winter with just Scrubs, sliders, and a Community jacket that you can't have in your cell. I blame Inspector General cuz I've been complaining for a year and they haven't changed nothing.

I know my Rights, I was born in America! I have the Right to chose Islam and Perform it! I was also sent to SEG for praying during lant at my book at my obligatory prayer time. I was also fined \$25.00. This is a violation of my 1st Amend. Right. See case # Chapman v. Pickett, et al., No 77-1859, 586 F.2d 22 and Jackson v. Main, 186 F.3d 314, 320

#### REASONS FOR GRANTING THE PETITION

This writ will effect and help not just me, but the entire State of OR. Our Right to Perform any religion we choose shouldn't be infringed upon. Also, it is cruel that E.O.C.I. looks at winter clothes as a ~~privilege~~. Other Institutions in OR at least give us thermos, but that's it. We pray for justice!
