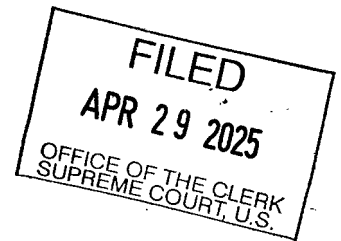

QUESTION(S) PRESENTED

1. Does the United States Constitution and the constitution of Florida, guarantee that the petition for a writ of habeas corpus will be adjudicated on the merits with a return of the writ and an evidentiary hearing for pretrial detainees upon a prima facie showing of unconstitutional detention when it is well established that habeas corpus has not been suspended?
2.
