Re: Motion to Extend Time to File Brief in Opposition to Petition for a Writ of Certiorari

Dear Mr. Harris,

Pursuant to Rule 30.4, Respondents request a thirty-day extension to file a brief in opposition to the petition for a writ of certiorari in the above-captioned matter. Respondents' brief is currently due January 2, 2026. With this extension, the brief would be due February 2, 2026.

Respondents request this extension because of staffing and printing issues caused by the upcoming holidays. This is compounded by the fact that the petition, from Respondents' perspective, makes numerous misstatements of the factual record which will take considerable time to address adequately, as will the underlying complex legal arguments involved in the petition. Moreover, lead counsel for Respondents is engaged in a week-long *Daubert* hearing this month in the Baby Food MDL—*In re: Baby Food Prods. Liab. Litig.*, Case No. 24-md-03101-JSC (N.D. Cal.)—further reducing the amount of time Respondents will be able to work on the opposition during the already-compressed holiday season. This is Respondents' first request for extension.
