MOTION FOR LEAVE TO PROCEED IN FORMA PAUPERIS

Petitioner, Aaron J. Thorpe, through CJA counsel, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3006A and Rule 39.1 of this Court, respectfully requests leave to proceed in forma pauperis before this Court and to file the attached Petition For Writ Of Certiorari to the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit without prepayment of filing fees or costs.
