

Regarding Providence Public Schools the plaintiff cannot attest to a termination of employment date seeing as no termination notice from Providence Public Schools' Human Resources has been mailed to the plaintiff. According to the Teacher Tenure Act, by March 1st prior to the termination is the deadline for notification to the teacher. For convenience purposes a sample of a random notice from Human Resources is attached to accompany this Affidavit as "Exhibit F". "Exhibit F" shows that it is common practice for the Providence Teachers' Union to receive copies of all notifications regarding any and all of their union members. A termination hearing was held by the school board but the Plaintiff received U.S. Postal service Certified mail notification of the meeting AFTER the termination hearing had already taken place without her presence. Therefore, the Plaintiff remains on an ambiguous non-paid leave as of 6-30-23.
