Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 30.4, the State of Louisiana (through Warden Darrel Vannoy) respectfully requests an extension of 30 days, to and including April 12, 2026, within which to file its brief in opposition to the petition for writ of certiorari in *Robinson v. Vannoy*, No. 25-6549. Under Rule 15.1, the State is required to file a response in this capital case. On the grant of the State's first motion for extension of time, the State's brief in opposition is currently due on March 13, 2026.

This is the State's second request for an extension of time. The extension is needed in light of other deadlines and conflicts faced by undersigned counsel of record for the State during the existing briefing period and immediately thereafter, including the following: oral argument at a preliminary-injunction hearing in *Louisiana v. FDA*, No. 25-cv-1491 (W.D. La.), on February 24; two lawsuits to be filed on March 10; an amicus brief in support of the petition for writ of certiorari in *Guerrero v. Johnson*, No. 25-1003 (U.S.), due on March 25; and a brief in opposition in *Galbraith v. Vannoy*, No. 25-6213 (U.S.), due on March 30.
