

<sup>1</sup> The language in amended paragraph 4 is taken directly from the parties' Stipulated Custody Order of December 22, 2023 and represents an obligation Father voluntarily undertook of his own accord. As we noted in our Rule 1925 Opinion on appeal, Father's psychotherapist-patient privileged was never breached at the hearing because Father was never compelled to provide the testimony to which he objected on the grounds of privilege. Consequently, an additional hearing to correct or redact testimony is unnecessary. Our Temporary Order as to custody remains intact and is not affected in any way by Father's refusal to breach his privilege. No tainted evidence was provided and our Order remains supported by the legitimate and admissible facts as they were presented to the Court on January 3, 2025.



Dear Mr. Givey,

I have reviewed your emails to the County Detectives and reread your allegations here today. Though I can appreciate your frustration with the Borough Codes Enforcement personnel, I do not see a violation of the Pennsylvania Criminal Code. You bring up several actions of the code enforcement personnel (citing inapplicable fire and building codes, etc) and claim that they are inappropriately charged to you or inapplicable to you. These are possible defenses available to you both in civil court as well as in any summary criminal proceedings that may arise. In all of the instances that you cite to in your emails, you should have some form of due process afforded to you. Whether it is with a Magisterial District Judge or a Common Pleas Judge you should have a venue for your complaints to be heard during your hearing.

To be properly represented during these hearings you should hire an attorney. The District Attorney's Office does not have the jurisdiction to file a civil injunction against the Borough on your behalf. If you feel this is an appropriate form of relief, I again urge you to hire counsel and begin that process. I understand that hiring a lawyer is an expense that you may or may not want to bear but the District Attorney's Office is not in a position to investigate or prosecute the Borough based upon the allegations you have stated.

otherwise appealable. As noted by this Court in its Judgment Order at 153 EDA 2025, Paragraphs 1 and 3 of the May 15, 2025 Temporary Custody Order are not appealable since custody claims still remain pending before the trial court. **See G.B. v. M.M.B., supra.**

Moreover, Amended Paragraph 2 of the May 15, 2025 Temporary Custody Order is not appealable since it directs that Father undergo a psychological evaluation with risk assessment with Doctor Gransee, costs shared evenly. Father shall provide Doctor Gransee with copies of Exhibits M3 and M-4 from the January 3, 2025 hearing. Paragraph 2 is not final or otherwise appealable as a collateral order. **See Miller v. Steinbach**, 681 A.2d 775 (Pa. Super. 1996)(order directing father to submit to psychological evaluation in the parties' custody matter was quashed as not appealable as a final or collateral order).

Lastly, the trial court indicates that the Amended Paragraph 4 of the May 15, 2025 Temporary Custody Order was entered by the trial court pursuant to the parties' Stipulated December 22, 2023 at paragraph 13. Paragraph 4 states that Father currently engages in individual therapy, Father shall continue to engage in therapy until his therapist determines that it is no longer necessary or warranted, Father shall take all medications prescribed to him by his therapist, and Father shall provide Mother with documentation that he is attending therapy and is compliant with all recommended treatment. In light of the fact that Father stipulated to this directive in the December 22, 2023 Order this Court does not have jurisdiction over a matter in which the Appellant has agreed to. **See Miller v. Miller**, 744 A.2d 778 (Pa. Super. 1999) (appellant acquiesced to the orders, he cannot now be heard to seek remediation with respect to those orders), *citing Karkaria v. Karkaria*, 592 A.2d 64 (Pa. Super. 1991) (party who has acquiesced in order or judgment may not later be heard to challenge it).

On June 15, 2025, Appellant filed a response as to why the appeal should not be quashed as to both the January 3<sup>rd</sup> and the May 15<sup>th</sup> Temporary Custody Orders, but Appellant failed to address the issues and caselaw raised by this Court's rule to show cause as to appealability. Instead, Appellant assails that he should not have to undergo a psychological evaluation as ordered. However, such a directive is not appealable. **See Miller v. Steinbach, supra.** Appellant also complains that his custody rights have been suspended. But such a directive is not appealable. **See G.B. v. M.M.B., supra.** Appellant baldly avers that the issues on appeal are collateral as to "whether trial court complied with this Court's remand". However, it was the trial court who requested remand as to Paragraph 4 of the January 3, 2025 Temporary Custody Order and the trial court replaced the language in

Paragraph 4 of the January 3, 2025 Temporary Custody Order with the language of Paragraph 13 from the December 22, 2023 Stipulated Order. **See *Miller v. Miller, supra* and *Karkaria v. Karkaria, supra*.**

Accordingly, the appeal at 1318 EDA 2025 is **QUASHED**.

Appellant's "Application to Strike", filed June 20, 2025, is **DISMISSED as MOOT**.



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

NOW, November 7, 2024, upon review of Ryan P. Givey's (Petitioner) October 11, 2024 "Temporary Emergency Injunction [sic] To Provide Witness Protection" (Petition), the Petition shall be treated as a petition for review addressed to this Court's original jurisdiction under Chapter 15 of the Pennsylvania Rules of Appellate Procedure and be governed thereby.<sup>1</sup>

Petitioner's October 28, 2024 "Application for Emergency Relief" (Emergency Application), seeking "an emergency injunction for witness protection,"

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<sup>1</sup> The Petition states in narrative form a series of events which led Petitioner to seek assistance from local law enforcement agencies, the courts, and the Attorney General to file private criminal complaints against unidentified persons, all to no avail. The Court discerns from the Petition, among other things, that Petitioner was a teacher who had some part in the discharge of two other school employees. He was involved in two car accidents, and upon his return to work after an absence, he started to receive fabricated poor performance evaluations. He bought three rental properties, which were subject to violation notices that were used to reduce his income. Petitioner further claims that there has been interference with his social media accounts and internet platforms, that he and his daughter have gained weight that cannot be explained except by tampering with their food, that his home has been transgressed, and that he and his siblings have been followed and drugged. Petitioner also indicates that he was wrongfully diagnosed with schizoaffective disorder. He asks the Court for an order compelling Respondent to issue a criminal complaint, or in the alternative, to assign a special prosecutor or grand jury, and to provide Petitioner and his family with witness protection.

is DENIED. Petitioner's Petition does not comply with the pleading rules of the Pennsylvania Rules of Appellate Procedure and the Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure and, therefore, has not triggered Michelle A. Henry's (Respondent) duty to file a responsive pleading to the Petition. Moreover, Petitioner's Emergency Application fails to allege the necessary prerequisites for mandamus relief wherein Petitioner seeks an order compelling Respondent to issue a criminal complaint, assign a special prosecutor, or convene a grand jury to investigate criminal action, and to provide Petitioner and his family with witness protection.

Petitioner's November 5, 2024 "Second Application for Emergency Relief" is DENIED. Therein, Petitioner asks the Court to approve his first Emergency Application, which is addressed above. To the extent Petitioner observes that his email address was improperly logged, the Court's Case Management System has been updated. If the issue persists, Petitioner is directed to contact the PACFile Help Desk at 717-795-2097. Finally, Petitioner's request of an immediate audience with a Judge is DENIED.

Petitioner's November 5, 2024 "Request for Default Judgment" is DENIED. As noted above, Petitioner's October 11, 2024 Petition has not triggered Respondent's duty to respond, and Petitioner has not followed the proper procedure to obtain a default judgment. Moreover, the time to respond, if triggered, is governed by Pa.R.A.P. 1516(b), which grants the opposing party 30 days in which to file a responsive pleading.

### FIRST AMENDMENT OF THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION

Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.

## APPENDIX X-2

### FOURTEENTH AMENDMENT OF THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION

All persons born or naturalized in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States and of the State wherein they reside. No State shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any State deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws.

## APPENDIX X-3

### TITLE 23 Pa Code § 5424 TEMPORARY EMERGENCY JURISDICTION

**(a) General rule.**--A court of this Commonwealth has temporary emergency jurisdiction if the child is present in this Commonwealth and the child has been abandoned or it is necessary in an emergency to protect the child because the child or a sibling or parent of the child is subjected to or threatened with mistreatment or abuse.

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**(b) No previous custody determination or proceeding.**--If there is no previous child custody determination that is entitled to be enforced under this chapter and a child custody proceeding has not been commenced in a court of a state having jurisdiction under sections 5421 (relating to initial child custody jurisdiction) through 5423 (relating to jurisdiction to modify determination), a child custody determination made under this section remains in effect until an order is obtained from a court of a state having jurisdiction under sections 5421 through 5423. If a child custody proceeding has not been or is not commenced in a court of a state having jurisdiction under sections 5421 through 5423, a child custody determination made under this section becomes a final determination if it so provides and this Commonwealth becomes the home state of the child.

**(c) Previous custody determination or proceeding.**--If there is a previous child custody determination that is entitled to be enforced under this chapter or a child custody proceeding has been commenced in a court of a state having jurisdiction under sections 5421 through 5423, any order issued by a court of this Commonwealth under this section must specify in the order a period that the court considers adequate to allow the person seeking an order to obtain an order from the state having jurisdiction under sections 5421 through 5423. The order issued in this Commonwealth remains in effect until an order is obtained from the other state within the period specified or the period expires.

---

(d) **Mandatory communication between courts.**--A court of this Commonwealth which has been asked to make a child custody determination under this section, upon being informed that a child custody proceeding has been commenced in or a child custody determination has been made by a court of a state having jurisdiction under sections 5421 through 5423, shall immediately communicate with the other court. A court of this Commonwealth which is exercising jurisdiction pursuant to sections 5421 through 5423, upon being informed that a child custody proceeding has been commenced in or a child custody determination has been made by a court of another state under a statute similar to this section, shall immediately communicate with the court of that state to resolve the emergency, protect the safety of the parties and the child and determine a period for the duration of the temporary order.

#### APPENDIX X-4

42 Pa.C.S. § 5944

#### CONFIDENTIAL COMMUNICATIONS

#### TO PSYCHIATRIST OR LICENSED PSYCHOLOGISTS

No psychiatrist or person who has been licensed under the act of March 23, 1972 (P.L.136, No.52), to practice psychology shall be, without the written consent of his client, examined in any civil or criminal matter as to any information acquired in the course of his professional services in behalf of such client. The confidential relations and communications between a psychologist or psychiatrist

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and his client shall be on the same basis as those provided or prescribed by law between an attorney and client.

#### APPENDIX X-5

#### TITLE 231 Pa. CODE RULE 1915.8

#### PHYSICAL AND MENTAL EXAMINATION OF PERSONS

(a) The court may order the child(ren) and/or any party to submit to and fully participate in an evaluation by an appropriate expert or experts. The order, which shall be substantially in the form set forth in Rule 1915.18, may be made upon the court's own motion, upon the motion of a party with reasonable notice to the person to be examined, or by agreement of the parties. The order shall specify the place, manner, conditions and scope of the examination and the person or persons by whom it shall be made and to whom distributed. In entering an order directing an evaluation pursuant to this rule, the court shall consider all appropriate factors including the following, if applicable:

(1) the allocation of the costs, including insurance coverage, if any, attendant to the undertaking of the evaluation and preparation of the resultant report and court testimony of any appointed expert;

(2) the execution of appropriate authorizations and/or consents to facilitate the examination;

(3) any deadlines imposed regarding the completion of the examination and payment of costs;

---

(4) the production of any report and of underlying data to counsel and/or any unrepresented party upon the completion of the examination; and

(5) any additional safeguards that are deemed appropriate as a result of the alleged presence of domestic violence and/or child abuse.

(b) Unless otherwise directed by the court, the expert shall deliver to the court, to the attorneys of record for the parties, to any unrepresented party, and to the guardian ad litem and/or counsel for the child, if any, copies of any reports arising from the evaluation setting out the findings, results of all tests made, diagnosis and conclusions. No reports shall be filed of record or considered evidence unless and until admitted by the court. Any report which is prepared at the request of a party, with or without a court order, and which a party intends to introduce at trial, must be delivered to the court and the other party at least thirty days before trial. If the report or any information from the evaluator is provided to the court, the evaluator shall be subject to cross-examination by all counsel and any unrepresented party without regard to who obtains or pays for the evaluation.

(c) If a party refuses to obey an order of court made under subdivision (a) of this rule, the court may make an order refusing to allow the disobedient party to support or oppose designated claims or defenses, prohibiting the party from introducing in evidence designated documents, things or testimony, prohibiting the party from introducing evidence of physical or mental condition, or making such other order as is just. The willful failure or refusal of a party to comply with an order entered pursuant to this rule may also give rise to a finding of contempt and the imposition

of such sanctions as may be deemed appropriate by the court, including, but not limited to, an adverse inference against the non-complying party.

(d) A petition for contempt alleging failure to comply with an order entered pursuant to subdivision (a) of this rule shall be treated in an expedited manner.

#### APPENDIX X-6

#### CHESTER COUNTY LOCAL CIVIL RULE 200 A

#### INDIVIDUAL ASSIGNMENT OF CASES

For matters set forth in categories A, B and C, when the case is commenced it shall be assigned for trial and pre-trial proceedings to a designated judge. The designated judge shall be responsible for the matter from the time of initial filing until final disposition, unless otherwise directed by the President Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of Chester County. The assignment of the case shall be made by the prothonotary in accordance with regulations promulgated by the president judge. The assignment regulations shall create a blind rotation system which balances *the case loads among the judges*. The sequence of assignment shall be kept secret and all steps shall be taken to prevent any person from being able to ascertain the name of the judge to whom any case may assigned before the assignment. When an action is commenced (whether by writ, complaint or otherwise) the papers filed with the prothonotary must be accompanied by a cover sheet in the form provided by the prothonotary and designed to assist the prothonotary in the assignment of each case.
