PETITIONER'S MOTION TO PROCEED IN FORMA PAUPERIS

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COMES NOW the Petitioner, Illiana Grigoriou, and moves this Court, pursuant to Rule 39.1, Rules of the Supreme Court, to declare her indigent and allow her to proceed in forma pauperis in this cause, in particular to waive any filing fees. As grounds therefore, Petitioner says:

1. Petitioner applies for a writ of certiorari to review the decision of the Fourth District Court of Appeal of Florida affirming her conviction for assault.

2. Petitioner has been declared indigent, and she proceeded as an indigent at her state court proceedings and during her state court appeal.

3. Petitioner continues to be indigent and without funds to pay any fees or costs in this action. The state court below appointed the Public Defender as counsel for Petitioner as an indigent party pursuant to sections 27.51 and 924.17, Florida Statutes (providing for appointment of counsel for indigents in criminal trial and appellate court cases, and authorizing in forma pauperis criminal appeals upon the court's determination of the defendant's indigency); Fla. R. Crim. P. (providing counsel to indigents); Fla. R. App. P. 9.430

(providing for appellate proceedings by indigents).

4. Federal law requires all courts of the United States to allow commencement and prosecution of any suit without prepayment of fees or costs upon the showing made above. 28 U.S.C. §1915(a).

5. Refusal to allow Petitioner to proceed in forma pauperis would deny her equal protection of the law, meaningful access to the courts, and due process of law since he cannot otherwise get the review to which a more affluent defendant would be entitled. *See Burns v. Ohio*, 360 U.S. 252 (1959) (fees should be waived for discretionary appeal by indigent); *Smith v. Bennett*, 365 U.S. 708 (1961) (fees should be waived for indigent prisoner seeking state habeas relief).

WHEREFORE, Petitioner moves that this Court declare her indigent and allow filing and prosecution of her petition without payment of any fees or costs.
