APPENDIX A
AFFIDAVIT OF JEANIE ROCHELLE WITT
(April 3, 2024 Incident)

On Wednesday April 3rd Billy and I were coming home from buying groceries. At approximately 3: 30, a Clay county sheriff's office vehicle pulled up behind us with its red and blue lights flashing indicating that we needed to pull our automobile over onto the side of the road, which we did. Deputy Kenyon approached our automobile on the passenger side and spoke to Billy through the passenger side window. Billy spoke first and asked for his name and badge and to which deputy Kenyon did respond and gave his name and badge number. Billy then asked if there was an emergency and if he could be of assistance. Deputy Kenyon said the reason that he had pulled us over was because our tags were out. Billy informed the officer that he was not acting in a commercial capacity nor was he driving but that he was traveling under common law in his private form of transportation. The officer became very agitated and started demanding that my husband show him identification. My husband asked the officer if he had reasonable articulate suspicion that my husband had committed a crime. The officer said he didn't need reasonable suspicion and that if my husband didn't present ID that he would arrest him for failure to identify. My husband then asked if he was under arrest or if he was being detained. He asked if he was free to go, the officer said no. At that point my husband told the officer that he wanted to invoke his fifth amendment rights. This made the officer mad and he continued to question and threaten my husband and again he said he wanted to invoke his fifth amendment rights. That's when the officer left my side of the car and went around to my husband's side of the vehicle and told him to get out . My husband asked the officer if his body camera was on because he wanted to make sure that all of the interaction was recorded and the officer stated that yes it was on. My husband had also asked for the officer to get his supervisor. The officer continued to threaten my husband, and told him to get out of the car. My husband told him he wasn't doing anything, and he wasn't going to get out of the car. He also told the officer he was of no authority to him. My husband was sitting there facing forward in the vehicle with his hands up and told him that he wasn't going to impede him in any way but he wasn't going to help him get him out. The officer then reached into the window, unlocked the door, opened the car door, pulled my husband out of the car, put him in cuffs, pushed my husband to his car and the entire time there was a verbal exchange going on and I do not know what all was said other than what my husband has told me. As I watched my husband being forcibly moved towards the officer's patrol car I reached over and closed my driver side door that had been left open because there was so much traffic driving by at a high rate of speed because we were on the highway. As I was doing that I noticed that Billy and the officer were really having an exchange of words so I paid closer attention and that's when I saw the officer practically throw Billy down on the ground. It wasn't long after that, that the officer was coming back to my window to start asking me questions. Since I like to be cooperative, I acknowledged him and did my best to answer his questions while still trying to protect myself. The deputy felt that obviously my husband had to be on something based on how he was behaving. I told the officer that "this vape was the only thing in the car he had been exposed to" and I held it up. It was a CBD vape that was legally purchased in Texas. I was raised to trust police officers,so when the officer asked if he could see the vape, I said sure and handed it to him. He smelled it and said "this smells like marijuana!" and he immediately became unhinged. The officer asked me if he could search my vehicle, I suggested he would need a search warrant and he said " I don't need a search warrant I have reasonable suspicion your husband's on something" and I said "well this is all we've been doing this is all we've had. The vape is all we've had all day, this is it." and he got madder and madder

because of that

vape. He did not listen to reason about where the vape was bought or why it was legal. He did not want to even discuss the facts about where it came from, he did not test the vape for the percentage of marijuana or THC or whatever he believed it contained. He just assumed based on what he thought he smelled. Then he decided to reach into my car and pull me out of the vehicle, remove my phone from my hand because I was on the phone, handcuffed me and pulled me out of the vehicle. As the officer was leading me to a spot between my vehicle and his vehicle he told me to stand right here and be still, keep in mind I was constantly having to shift between my **prosthetic** foot and my real foot because that's just how I have to keep my balance especially when I had my hands handcuffed behind my back. As the officer was searching my car I told him I did not give consent well then he also turned around and told me to quit moving or he would give me another charge, I told him that I'm an amputee and I have a prosthetic leg and because of the incline that I was standing on I was having a hard time and I had to move around in order to keep from falling and he said well you look like you're doing just fine quit moving. Then once we got to the jail, I wasn't allowed to make a phone call till midnight or so, keep in mind I have two children at home who were also traumatized while they were young because of my health condition and this incident just added to the list of things that have traumatized them because they didn't hear from me until midnight that night. I understand if I had hurt someone, but I was arrested for a legal item that I purchased at a gas station. I found out once I got there that I was being strip searched by order of the deputy. I do not have a criminal record, so I have never been strip searched prior to this incident. I was traumatized, to say the least. There was a "trainee" in the room during the strip search, so the entire process was discussed, like I was an animal in a cage. There were comments made from the senior officer to the trainee, such as "you just have to make sure that you can see under all of their rolls and stuff" The young lady who was training looked very much like one of my sons' former classmates and we live in a relatively small town/area. So now I have that forever in my head, as well. I also had to remove my prosthetic leg during the strip search. I was made to feel less than, over a legal vape. Why? I can only assume it was because he was mad at my husband, that is what it looked like at that moment.

APPENDIX B
AFFIDAVIT OF BILLY MARVIN WITT III
(April 3, 2024 Incident)

On April 3rd at approximately 3:30 in the afternoon my wife and I were traveling northbound on highway 79 between Petrolia and Byers Texas. I observed a sheriff's car passing the car behind me to pull in behind me, at which point he turned on his emergency lights. I pulled over and the deputy walked up to my passenger window where my wife was sitting. I asked the officer for his name and badge number which he proceeded to tell me and then I asked what his emergency was and how could I help him. At that point the officer, Billy Kenyon, stated that he stopped me because I didn't have a tag displayed on my Range Rover and then asked to see my driver's license. I informed the officer that I was not acting in a commercial capacity nor was I driving but that I was traveling under common law in my private mode of transportation. The officer started getting hostile and demanded that I show him identification. I then asked if he had reasonable articulable suspicion that I had committed a crime, he said something like he didn't need it and if I didn't identify he would arrest me for failure to identify. I then asked him if I was under arrest, he told me I was being detained, I then asked if I was free to go and he said no. At that point I told the officer that I wanted to invoke my fifth amendment rights, this made him mad and he continued to ask questions and threaten me, again I told him I wanted to invoke my fifth amendment rights. He then came around to the driver side window and told me to get out. I told him to get his supervisor. He continued to threaten me and tell me to get out of the car. I told him I wasn't doing anything that he told me to do and he has no authority to tell me to do anything. I was holding my hands up and informed him I was not going to be combative or impede him in any way but I wasn't getting out and he needed to get his supervisor. He then opened my door and took me out of my car and put me in cuffs. I told him he didn't have the right to do what he was doing and that I did not consent nor did I contract. As he pushed me to his car I informed him he works for a private corporation and has no authority to do what he was doing. He opened the rear driver door on his patrol car and he began to search me. I told him that I did not consent and he said he didn't need it. At some point in our exchange of words he became very angry and proceeded to assault me by pushing me down into the back of his car. Then I watched as he went back to talk to my wife. I noticed he grabbed something from my wife's hands then grabbed her door and opened it and pulled her out and took her phone that she was on a call on. At that point I went red and started screaming at him and talking crazy. My wife has never broken the law nor has she ever harmed anyone. She had done nothing wrong and I was just screaming stuff as I watched him threatening my wife if she didn't remain still. She was rocking back and forth because she is disabled and has a prosthetic leg! Her balance is very bad plus she was on an incline with her hands handcuffed behind her back as she was trying not to fall. I watched him tell her she better quit moving, he came back and told me I was going to jail and she was too for possession of The vape that my wife had informed him was legally bought here in Texas right down the road. He didn't listen or care. I informed the officer that we had been grocery shopping that afternoon and had two kids at home and \$500 worth of groceries in the back of our car. Another officer came and took my wife away, a wrecker came and loaded up my car, and I was transported to the jail. When I got there I found out my wife had been strip searched, made to spread her butt cheeks, and made to take off her leg. She was humiliated,

degraded, and now is afraid to leave the house. We were not allowed a phone call for almost 10 hours, even after telling them we had kids at home. I was held in a cell with no water and was refused to drink for over 6 hours. We were held overnight without seeing anyone, even after asking still to see a supervisor the next morning. They dropped the possession charge and made up something else, they dropped the charge on me as well but then charged me for felony assault on an officer. My wife and I broke absolutely no law. The vape arrested US on was bought in a smoke shop in Wichita Falls Texas and is Texas compliant. A traffic violation isn't interestable offense. We were traveling and enjoying our day and we were lawful in every way. We were assaulted, taken against our will, our children were put at risk, and my wife's life was put in extreme jeopardy. My wife has had a stroke, a ruptured brain aneurysm, and congestive heart failure. She has lupus, encephalomalacia, and is epileptic. She is also an amputee, so she is on full disability and social security. She needs 24-hour care. I had to raise hell to get her meds up to her. I pleaded with them to give her her Life alert button because they just came around every hour or so to look in on her but the stress she was under I was afraid for her life and so were our children.

I committed no crime nor did the officer suspect me of one; he illegally used his emergency lights to trick me into pulling over for him. He then proceeded to trespass and violate my property, kidnap me, and assault my wife both physically and sexually. She feels completely violated, embarrassed, degraded and terrified that the whole scenario could happen again. She is now in fear of leaving the house because she realizes that the police don't know the law nor do they have to follow it. She doesn't want to be anywhere that an officer can come into contact with her. She always followed the law and never dreamed that she could be violated that way. All I did was stand up for my rights. I know my rights therefore they do apply to me. This officer clearly has an ego problem and feels he is entitled to violate the public because he is a sheriff's department deputy. This is noticed that we will be filing on this officer surety bond and filing suit on the sheriff's department if this officer is not removed immediately and an apology made to my wife, financial compensation for the cost to get her car out of impound, as well as financial compensation for emotional stress and trauma to my wife.

AFFIDAVIT OF JEANIE ROCHELLE WITT
(June 2025 Bond Reduction Hearing)

STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF CLAY

BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, personally appeared Jeanie Rochelle Witt, who, after being duly sworn, deposes and states as follows:

1. My name is Jeanie Rochelle Witt. I am over the age of 18, competent to make this affidavit, and have personal knowledge of the facts stated herein.
2. On July 14, 2025, I personally appeared in the 97th Judicial District Court for a bond reduction hearing for my husband, Billy Marvin Witt III.
3. Prior to the hearing, I personally filed multiple motions for bond reduction on Billy's behalf. These filings were rejected multiple times by the court clerks and e-filing system for reasons related to formatting, wording, and minor technicalities. It took approximately five separate attempts before the paperwork was finally accepted.
4. Even after the bond reduction hearing was scheduled, I was required to file a Notice of Hearing. That notice was rejected and sent back to me for re-filing just days before the hearing, adding significant stress to an already difficult situation. These repeated rejections felt excessive and obstructive.
5. At the July 14th hearing, the judge refused to allow my husband to represent himself sui juris, despite his clearly stated intention to do so.
6. The judge also refused to review or consider the medical documentation I brought to court, which detailed my serious health conditions, including dangerously elevated blood pressure and recent severe weight loss. This documentation is attached to this affidavit as

Exhibit A. The refusal to review this documentation caused me significant emotional distress, as my health was central to the need for bond reduction.

7. Throughout the hearing, the judge coerced plea entries from multiple defendants, including entering a plea of not guilty on my husband's behalf over his objection.

8. The repeated filing rejections, combined with the court's refusal to hear critical medical evidence, placed my health at further risk. I was already under medical supervision for high blood pressure and stress-related complications. The delays and barriers imposed by the court exacerbated my condition.

9. During the July 14, 2025 hearing, I personally witnessed the judge attempt to appoint standby counsel for my husband against his stated wishes. The first attorney the court attempted to appoint stood up in open court and disclosed that he had previously discussed my husband's case with the District Attorney prior to being named as standby counsel. I witnessed this exchange personally, and it confirmed to me that there were pre-existing discussions between the prosecution and defense counsel about my husband's case before any official appointment was made.

10. Based on everything I witnessed during the July 14, 2025 hearing—including the court's refusal to allow my husband to represent himself, the repeated barriers to filing motions, the rejection of critical medical evidence, and the apparent collusion between the appointed counsel and the District Attorney—it is obvious to me that my husband cannot receive a fair trial in Clay County or any of the surrounding counties. The judicial bias and systemic misconduct are too deeply rooted.

11. Attached as Exhibit A is the same medical summary I attempted to present to the trial court on July 14, 2025, documenting my elevated blood pressure, weight loss, and associated health risks.

I make this affidavit voluntarily, under penalty of perjury, for use in our petition for habeas corpus and any related legal proceedings.

AFFIDAVIT OF BILLY MARVIN WITT III
(June 2025 Bond Reduction Hearing)

AFFIDAVIT OF BILLY MARVIN WITT III
REGARDING PROCEEDINGS OF JULY 14, 2025

I, Billy Marvin Witt III, hereby declare as follows:

1. My name is Billy Marvin Witt III. I am over the age of 18, competent to make this declaration, and have personal knowledge of the facts stated herein.
2. On July 14, 2025, I appeared in the 97th Judicial District Court in Clay County, Texas, for a bond reduction hearing.
3. At the start of the proceedings, I asserted my right to represent myself sui juris and informed the court that I did not consent to contract with the court, nor did I wish to have any court-appointed legal counsel.
4. The judge conducted roll call and, when calling my name, I identified myself as the empowered legal representative for the named person, consistent with my constitutional right to self-representation.
5. Upon realizing I was asserting my right to proceed sui juris, the judge announced she would come back around to me last, effectively moving my case to the end of the docket.
6. During the proceedings, the judge engaged in a pattern of entering not guilty pleas on behalf of all defendants present, regardless of whether they explicitly

consented to the plea. Some defendants responded to her statements, but not all did so freely or voluntarily. I personally refused to enter a plea, yet the court entered a plea of not guilty on my behalf over my objection.

7. The judge attempted to appoint standby counsel to me, despite my repeated assertion that I would be representing myself. The attorney she first named stood up in court and stated for the record that he had previously discussed my case with the District Attorney. This admission indicates that conversations about me took place between the defense and prosecution before any appointment was made, creating a clear conflict of interest.

8. After this conflict was disclosed, the court appointed a different attorney to act as standby counsel against my stated wishes.

9. During the bond reduction hearing, my wife, Jeanie Rochelle Witt, was present and attempted to present medical documentation related to her serious health conditions, including the fact that she depends on me for daily care as her primary caregiver. The court refused to acknowledge or review this documentation and did not permit her to present her statements in full.

10. The judge demonstrated bias throughout the proceeding, focusing primarily on whether I understood the risks of representing myself. She refused to discuss the bond reduction on its merits or consider the medical factors we presented in support of the request.


11. The events of July 14, 2025, further reinforce my belief that I cannot receive a

fair trial in Clay County or the Tri-County area, and that I am being subjected to judicial overreach, collusion between the prosecution and defense bar, and retaliation for exercising my constitutional rights.
