Dear Mr. Harris:

As counsel of record for petitioner Carter Page, I write to inform the Court that petitioner has reached an agreement with the United States. See U.S. Br. 6 (acknowledging settlement). Because of this settlement, he is releasing his claims against the United States, the United States Department of Justice, and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. All parties will bear their own costs, expenses, and fees.

But petitioner is not seeking dismissal of his petition because he has not reached any agreement with the individual respondents—each of which is sued in their individual capacities. See U.S. Br. 6 (“The settlement does not involve petitioner’s claims against the individual defendants.”). Thus, although the Court should not consider the United States, its agencies, or its official-capacity employees to be parties to this case moving forward, the Court should grant the petition for the reasons stated there and in the forthcoming reply.
